Session Abstract

Released a little more than a year ago, COBIT 5 provides a comprehensive framework that assists enterprises to achieve their goals and deliver value through effective governance and management of enterprise IT. As with prior versions of the framework, COBIT 5 helps enterprise maintain IT-related risk at an acceptable level, optimise the cost of IT services and technology, and achieve operational excellence through reliable and efficient application of technology. But there are many changes to this latest version of COBIT and those changes are directly focused on the business. COBIT 5 has been designed to help enterprises and their executives maintain quality information to support business decisions and generate business value from IT-enabled investments, i.e., achieve strategic goals and realise business benefits through effective and innovative use of IT. COBIT 5 describes how those benefits can be realized to create enterprise stakeholder value.

The acute business focus of COBIT 5 creates new challenges for organizations implementing the framework and a solid understanding of this business focus and the role the business plays in COBIT is key to the success of any COBIT initiative. This presentation will take a deep-dive into this business focus and role and provide attendees with an appreciation for what makes COBIT 5 so uniquely different from every version ISACA has published in the past.
