Session Abstract

The Committee Of Sponsoring Organizations (COSO) released a new version of the COSO Framework in 2013, and companies are required to comply with the new framework beginning this year (2014). There are now 17 sections to comply with, versus the prior five. This session will provide a brief history of COSO's origins, and an overview of the COSO framework along with relevant examples. After attending this session, attendees will be better equipped to evaluate their organization's level of compliance and identify areas that need improvement.
